

Marvin and Jim Jacobson were best friends in high school. All the teens would hang out at the shop on Railroad Blvd. Paddy would buy gasoline there because they sold Shell. Paddy's mom said well you know if I was a young girl "I would set my cap for that boy Marvin King". Gas in those days was .15 cents a gallon. She was going to beauty school, always in a hurry and never had time to get gas. Often her car had to be pushed into the station. They all gave her a hard time. Marvin was there every time she ran out of gas. She was so embarrassed; I wasn't sure Marvin was for me. She only made a couple months of beauty college and quit and didn't stop at the station that much. Herb, Jim Jacobson's dad told Marvin "if I was a young man, I'd be looking at that Paddy Murphy". Herb said she was a good girl and was active in the church. Marvin didn't think she would go out with him. He finally got up his nerve and called one evening late. Paddy answered and Marvin asked her out on a date for Saturday, she was sleepy and not prepared for that question. He said he would pick her up at 7pm Saturday night. The next day she realized what she had done and wasn't for sure who it had been. June 6<sup>th</sup> was their first date, by the 12<sup>th</sup> of July they were engaged and by the 12<sup>th</sup> of September 1959 they were married at the Alvadore Christian Church. **Paddy Murphy King**



## **Alvadore Neighborhood Watch News**

Recent crime activity has been reported in the Alvadore area. From personal property thefts to rifling through unlocked automobiles and mail boxes. These activities have taken place at all times of the day and night. The best way to deter these types of activities is to keep automobiles locked and remove things of value from plain sight or do not keep them in the vehicle at all. Keep your personal property out of sight and locked up when possible. Extra lighting like motion lights are very beneficial in deterring crime. Keep trees and shrubs trimmed to eliminate hiding places. Consider a locking mail box. They are available at local hardware stores and there are several available online, some offer discounts if purchasing more than one so talk to your neighbors about getting one, too. Get to know your neighbors, watch out for each other. You might also want to consider installing security cameras, even trail cameras are useful. We will host a community watch meeting in June. Watch for details in the next newsletter. It is very important to contact the sheriff's office to report a crime or suspicious behavior; the non-emergency line is 541-682-4150.

The sheriff's office assumes there is no crime activity if none is reported. For more information, check out their web page. Please be sure to report any crimes you are aware of, even if it is after the fact.


